Importance of Interview and Survey Questions in Systems ...

Interviewing and surveying stakeholders (3), along with review of the current system ensures that you understand the situation before introducing any improvements (4) With the survey and interview results the analysis team would know exactly what requirements are essential to the end-users and which requirements would be nice, but are not
